



Lyndhurst (ST)

- Is an ideal solution to achieve access for disabled people in new or existing buildings, as it is so easy to have installed.
- The Lyndhurst (ST) is supplied fully enclosed which reduces associated building work and costs
- If a shallow pit cannot be provided, a simple ramp is all that is needed for wheelchair users.
- The well established and safe hydraulic drive offers reliability, convenient emergency release in the event of power failure and a comfortable 'ride'.
- Installation takes 2 to 4 days depending on the lift travel and specification.



Standard Supply:

Regulations: Built to comply with the Essential Safety Requirements of the Machinery Directive 98/37/EC and ISO 9386-1:2000 - Power operated lifting platforms for persons with impaired mobility.

Drive: The hydraulic drive unit is housed in a separate enclosure and will be installed in a convenient nearby location.

Max travel: 5 metres.

Mounting: Structure-supported.

Operation: Constant pressure push-button control.

Platform Size: 1100mm x 1400mm standard; 900mm x 1250mm or 900mm x 1400mm optional.

Entrances: Through-car entry; single entrance or adjacent entry.

Power supply: 240V single phase.

Min headroom:

Up to 2 metres travel:	2000mm.
2-3 metres travel:	2275mm.
3-4 metres travel:	2275-2675mm
4-5 metres travel:	2615-3175mm

Min pit or ramp: 70 mm (nominal).

Cabin speed: 0.08 m/s (nominal).

Rated load: 400kg standard.

Max number of stops: 2.

Landing doors: Manual operation swing door with vision panel.
(Options: Powered landing door; 1/2 hour fire door; 1 hour fire door).

Finish: Pearl grey car, blue handrail (optional alternative rail colours).
